



Dear Fellow Pastors and Leaders,

I want to invite you to participate in Boston's [Week of Prayer for Christian Unity](#), which is celebrated by Christians of all denominations and traditions throughout the world. Jesus prayed "they may be one so that the world may believe" (John 17:21) and this week is centered around remembering this prayer of our Lord Jesus Christ.

For the past two years, the [Institute for Christian Unity](#) and UniteBoston have partnered together to host Week of Prayer for Christian Unity gatherings. In 2017, we coordinated nightly liturgically-oriented prayer and worship gatherings and a [large worship service on January 21st](#) in alignment with the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, that had 8 co-sponsoring pastors and was attended by over 800 people. In 2018, we focused on fellowship across our congregations by hosting 8 dinners in different neighborhoods in alignment with the launch of UniteBoston's [neighborhood dinner initiative](#).

2019 Gatherings



In 2019, the theme is "Justice, Only Justice, You Shall Pursue," (Deuteronomy 16:20), which was chosen by Christians in Indonesia. We are coordinating a combination of worship services and neighborhood

dinners. The gatherings will focus attention on how we can contribute to acts of unity, justice and mercy in our personal lives and within our communities. Attending the worship services is a great way to experience the rich diverse forms of Christian worship that take place in our city. The neighborhood dinners are hosted by our wonderful team of [dinner coordinators](#) and are an opportunity to foster local relational connections towards greater justice in our neighborhoods. In particular, I would like to invite you to participate in the neighborhood dinner in the location closest to you, as well as the **anchor worship service on Saturday January 19th at 7:00pm**. This worship service is hosted by a number of downtown congregations, including the Paulist Center, the Cathedral of St Paul, and the Church of the Covenant. We would like to take time to honor local clergy at this gathering, and the worship service will be followed with a time of fellowship and refreshments. We would be honored by your presence at this gathering; please email me to let me know if you are planning to attend.

I have Week of Prayer for Christian Unity postcards with this year's schedule that I can give to you for free, if that would be helpful for you. In our coming together, we recognize the gifts that each community contributes to the larger Body of Christ and are strengthened in our public witness of Christ's reconciling work.
